The Memorials dedicated to-day, October 18, 1912, are circular bronze portrait reliefs, six feet in diameter, surrounded by a setting of Formosa marble and the whole being let into the marble walls on the east and west ends of the north porch of the State Capitol.

The Memorial to Senator Platt is on the west end and is by Hermon A. MacNeil of College Point, L. I. One of Mr. MacNeil's best known works is the Soldiers and Sailors Monument for the State of New York at Albany.

The Memorial to Senator Hawley is on the east end and is by Herbert Adams of New York City. Among Mr. Adams' works are the Channing Monument in Boston and the Bryant Monument in Bryant Park, New York City.

Messrs. MacNeil and Adams have both filled the office of President of the National Society of Sculpture.
