#### PREFACE

With this booklet the Stamford Genealogical Society makes its debut into the world of genealogical publications. With the work of a committee consisting of Mrs. Clifford P. Wickes, Jr., of Stamford, Mrs. Robert I. Cummin, formerly of Old Greenwich, Mr. George O. Pershing of Stamford, and Mr. Paul Prindle of Noroton Heights, as well as with great help from most members of the Society, we submit this booklet. We thank the many people of the community who cooperated in furnishing information.

We welcome inquiries. Those of a brief nature will be answered by our Society genealogist. For those requiring extensive research, we will suggest the name of a professional genealogist. Membership in our Society brings with it a regular Bulletin.



## CHURCHES

To avoid repetition, the following applies to the information on churches of the six towns:

Only churches existing prior to 1900 are included.

The date on extreme right is the date of founding of the church.

Dates of earliest records are given but the records are not necessarily complete.

Denominations are listed alphabetically; churches of each denomination are listed chronologically.

Records, either original or photostatic copies thereof, are usually kept in the church office or at the parsonage nearby. The address of church, and telephones of both church and parsonage are given. It is suggested that, if one wishes to examine records, an appointment be made by telephone.

One of best offices in the state. Card system started in 1939 by Harold W. Allen, Town Clerk, indexing from 1849 each birth, marriage, death on separate card. (85,657 cards made to 1939, 148,674 through 1958.) (All records are kept in vault room.)

Records from 1640 to 1850 were microfilmed in 1948 and placed in State Library in Hartford, and a second copy placed in the Litchfield Bank, third copy in Library in Salt Lake City, at no cost to Town, by Church of Latter Day Saints. (See Town Report for 1949.)
