The following is a report on the information that was available regarding the life of one Daniel McInerney. Daniel McInerney was a resident of the city of Danbury Ct. During his life time he was employed in the hating industry that made up the economic base of Danbury.

The first information that was gathered was found in the land grantee records located in the Danbury town Hall.

The documents were inregard to his purchase of land with in Danbury.

"First piece containing one acre, bounded north by land now or formerly of Ann Lynch, eeast by highway south and west by land now or formerly of Cornelius Delaney.

Second piece containing one and a half acres, more or less bounded north by Patrick Dolan, now or formerly east and south by land formerly of Steven Bates and west by the highway with the buildings there on.

Third piece containing two acres north by land now or formerly by Steven Bates, deceased. South by land now or formely of Patrick Doland west by the highway.

Fourth piece containing two and one half acres more or less bounded north by land James Barret now or formerly east by highway south and west by land now or formerly late of Henry Mead.

July 16 1892.

Daniel McInerney purchased this land apparently to be used as a pasture. But due to the illegible record this is subjective to my interpitation of the available evidence. The purchase consisted of twelve acres more or less bounded north by the estate of James Bauvet, deceased, east by highway, south by land of Anderson, west by brook separating Danbury & Norwalk R.R.

The following information was acquired from the death record of Daniel McInerney located in the Danbury town hall. He was born in the town of Killballyowen Ireland in the year 1847. He was the son of John McInerney and Margret Haugh. The point in time in which he immigrated to the United States is unknown. The only Census record that listed him that I was able to find was the U.S. Census for 1910. The Census listed him as being a resident of the town of Danbury Ct. living at the address of Great pasture Rd. with his wife. Daniel is listed as being a retired hatter and owner of the residence.

Daniel McInerney died on January 19, 1922. of Apoplexy after three days of illness and was buried in the Old Catholic Cemetery in Danbury Ct.
