In 1941 additional orders were received from High Standard and our facilities were offered to the American Bosch Corporation of Springfield, Mass. and Colt's Patent Firearms Company of Hartford, Conn. and orders were redeived and deliveries made.

Immediately after the Pearl Harbor attack, our President, Mr. A. C. Gilbert issued a Directive instructing all of our Management to immediately offer our entire facilities to the United States Government. Virtually our entire Selling Organization was withdrawn from civilian selling and physically contacted the Procurement Divisions of the Army. Navy, Engineers, Air Corps, Signal Corps and other Governmental Agencies in Washington and in our local district and other districts, as well as solicitation of other prime contractors but without much visible result with the single exception that we did receive from the Springfield Ordnance District an L.P.O. for 7500 M26 Parachute Flares on September 3, 1941 for delivery beginning January, 1942, which schedule was met.

This required a major reconversion, tools and dies to be made, new machinery and equipment to be acquired and installed.

The State and Local laws prevented assembly and loading at our main plant in New Haven. We immediately bought land in Branford, Conn., erected assembly and loading plants as well as several isolated storage buildings on account of the hazardous nature of material used. This was accomplished in less than four months and despite many design changes occasioned by tests that showed original faulty designing, we were able to start deliveries on time and complete the contract within time limits.

B7000 TRIM TAB MOTOR

In early December 1941 we received a telephone call from Curtiss Wright, Buffalo, N. Y. asking us if we could make an Electric Motor to operate a trim tab on a P-40 Curtiss Wright Fighter. We immediately sent our chief engineer by plane to Buffalo to analyize their problem, return to the factory and within 72 hours we designed and perfected, working day and night, a motor which after being put through vigorous tests was approved as being perfect for the job intended. Within five weeks we tooled up, got the material into the plant and put this motor into production and started deliveries.
