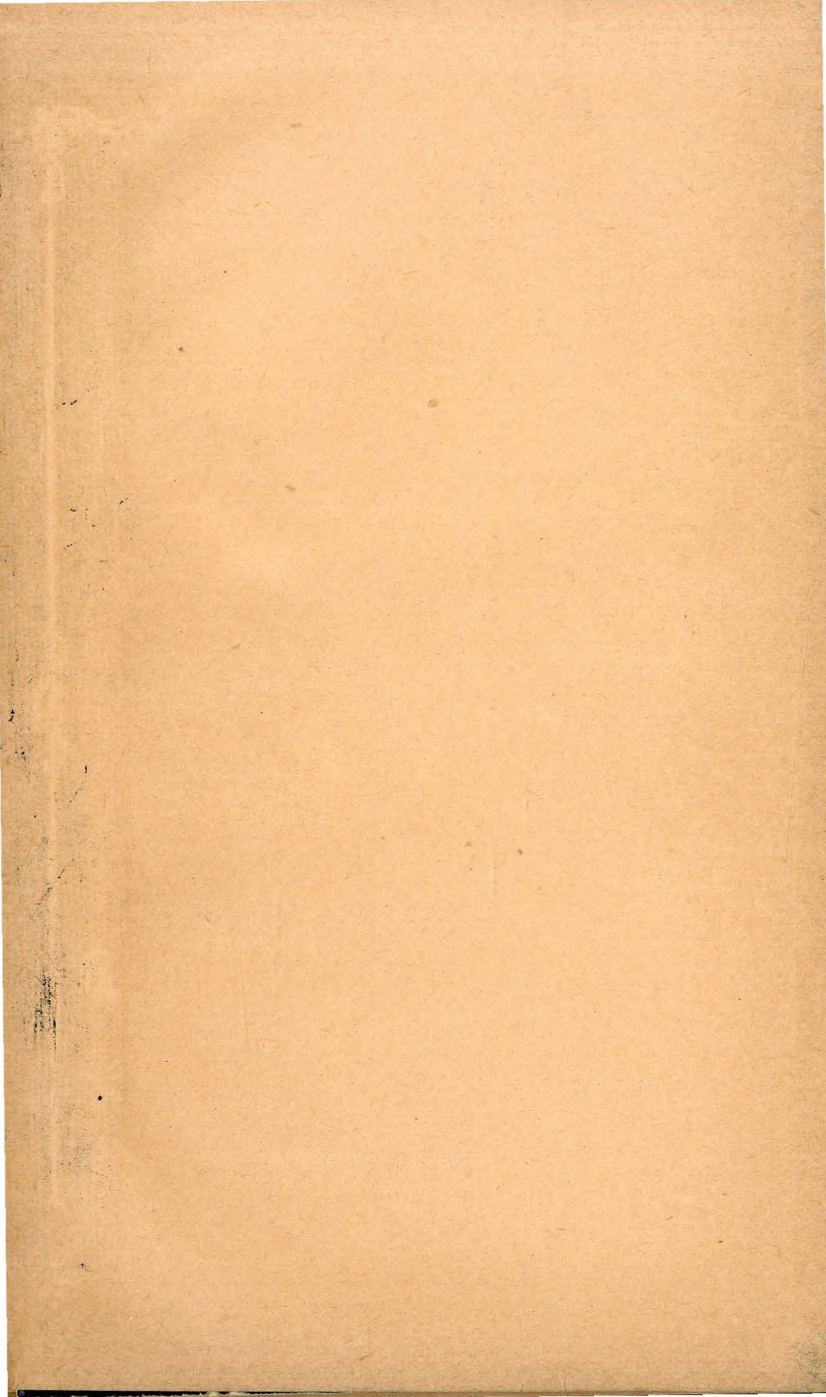

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# M A N U A L .

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In preparing a catalogue of all the persons who have been members of the Congregational Church in Branford, since its re-organization in March, 1688, the object of the compiler has been to lay before the present members of the church, and their friends, a manual, which will, at once, show the care of the great Head of the church over this portion of his heritage, and also mark the periods of prosperity and enlargement, as well as the seasons of depression or decline. In some years the accessions have been large; in other years, few or none have publicly joined themselves to the Lord. It may be interesting and profitable in tracing family names, to see the evidence that our God is a covenant keeping God, hopefully extending his mercy from generation to generation unto them that fear him, and keep his commandments; and as a new family name occurs, we see that the grace of God is not bound any more than his word, and that he extends his mercy beyond the pale of his visible church.

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## WHAT IS CONGREGATIONALISM ?

As this is called a Congregational Church, it may be useful to state some of the leading features of this form of Church Polity or organization. They are as follows :

The church is to be composed of none but persons of visible or hopeful piety. None are proper subjects for forming a church, or for being received into one already

formed, except those who profess repentance and Faith in Christ, and who consider themselves as renewed unto holiness by the power of the Holy Spirit; that while any particular church may be composed of any number of visible believers not less than five, no church ought to be larger than can conveniently meet in one place of worship—that every church is independent of every other as to its discipline and powers; that it is competent to choose its own officers—and to receive and exclude members, as the church judges agreeable to the laws of Christ,—that the government is republican; that every brother is equally entitled to vote or discuss the subjects which come before them; that the majority must rule, and the minority submit to their decisions, if it can be done without violating conscience. In the latter case they are to ask advice of council, or seek a regular dismission to another church. While Congregational churches are thus independent and complete organizations, each in itself, they yet hold themselves amenable to sister churches, so far as to ask and receive advice, and admonition from them—to call in their aid in settling or dismissing pastors—and to maintain fellowship with them in the ordinances of the church. Another principle of Congregationalism, is that there are two and but two Sacraments instituted by Jesus Christ, to be observed in the churches;—The Lord's Supper, in which the only elements or symbols to be used, are Bread and Wine. This ordinance is to be observed at proper intervals as convenience and utility may dictate. Some do it monthly, some quarterly, and more observe it once in two months. On this ordinance all the members are expected to attend, when not providentially hindered.

Baptism is to be administered to all adults believers on their admission to the church, unless they have been pre-



viously baptized. The households of Believers are also to be baptized. The application of water to the subject, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, by a duly authorized person—is valid whether done by sprinkling, affusion or plunging—though the application of water to the subject is considered more Scriptural than the application of the subject to the water. Congregationalists consider baptism as the symbol of the Spirit's operations on the heart. The Spirit in baptizing men is poured out, or shed down upon them. The practice of baptizing households, or the children of professors, was almost universally observed in the early Congregational churches of New England.

The officers of the Church are of two grades and only two—Pastors and deacons—*Pastors* who are promiscuously called in scripture, Bishops, Elders, Teachers, Ministers. Their business is to feed the flock of God, taking the oversight thereof, to preach the word, and administer the Sacraments. They are the stated moderators in church meetings, but have no vote except a casting vote. They have authority to call church meetings for business. Their duty is to call such meetings when properly requested by the church, to declare the decisions of the church, whether of excommunication, admonition, or suspension—to instruct and guide them, if need require, in cases of discipline.

The duty of deacons, who are to be chosen from the members of the church, is to take care of the church's poor, to serve tables, and assist the Pastor in the prayer meeting, and in visiting the sick, and from house to house, unless in cases where the church appoint persons specially for that purpose.

Many of the Congregational churches have standing committees, whose business it is to attend to cases of discipline, and prepare them, to be brought before the church for

trial. In some instances these committees retain their offices until they choose to resign, or until others are chosen. Sometimes they are chosen to serve for a limited period.

### CONSOCIATION OF CHURCHES.

This is an Ecclesiastical Organization, peculiar to the Congregational Churches of Connecticut, or nearly so. The leading feature is this. "That the churches which are neighboring each to other, shall consociate for mutually affording to each other such assistance as may be requisite, on all occasions ecclesiastical." The interpretation of this article, has been (and the usage has generally been in conformity with the interpretation,) that "*all occasions ecclesiastical,*" include Ordinations, Installations and Dismissions of Pastors;—Examinations of candidates for ordination or installation;—Occasions in which advice is asked by the churches or by individual members;—Hearing of appeals from the decisions of a consociated church;—Hearing and determining cases of discipline or difficulty submitted by a church to the consociation previous to trial;—Trial of pastors accused of scandal or heresy, on complaint or request of the association; and, in general deliberations and advice, concerning matters of common interest to the churches. The Ecclesiastical constitution which is usually called "The Saybrook Platform," and which recognizes the Consociation of Churches, was framed in consequences of an Act of the General Assembly, passed at a Session in 1708, as follows:—" *This assembly from their own observations, and the complaint of many others, being made sensible of the defects of the discipline of the churches of this government, arising from the want of a*

*more explicit asserting of the rules given for that end in the Holy Scriptures, from which would arise a permanent establishment among ourselves, a good and regular issue in cases subject to ecclesiastical discipline, glory to Christ our head, and edification to its members ; hath seen fit to ordain and require, and it is, by the authority of the same ordained and required, that the ministers of the several counties in this government shall meet together in their respective county towns, with such messengers as the churches to which they belong, shall see cause to send with them, on the last Monday in June, next ; there to consider and agree upon those methods and rules for the management of ecclesiastical discipline, which by them shall be adjudged agreeable to the word of God ; and shall at the same meeting appoint two or more of their number to be their delegates, who shall all meet together at Saybrook, at the next commencement to be held there, where they shall compare the results of the meetings of the several counties, and, out of and from them, draw a form of ecclesiastical discipline."*

In conformity with this act, the formula was prepared, since known as the Saybrook Platform, or the Ecclesiastical Constitution of the Congregational Churches, of Connecticut. It was presented to the General Assembly at its session in New Haven, on the 14th of October, 1708, and by that body approved and established.

This church early adopted that constitution, and remained under it until the Consociation attempted to silence and depose their pastor, the Rev. Philemon Robbins. They then withdrew and declared themselves independent. After the death of Mr. Robbins, and previous to the ordination of Mr. Atwater, by a formal vote they again adopted the Saybrook Platform, and they have remained consociated to the

present time. Lands have been purchased by the Society, and the rent appropriated to the support of a minister, settled according to the ecclesiastical constitution.

### STANDING COMMITTEES.

At a meeting held February 13th, 1809, the Church voted to appoint a committee to assist the Pastor in examining candidates for admission to fellowship and communion of this church.

In pursuance of this vote the following persons have at different times been chosen on this committee.

At a meeting of the first Church in Branford, January 4th, 1810, voted. That a committee of inspection and investigation be appointed, who, upon hearing anything re-

specting any members of the church, which is apprehended to be matter of public scandal and church censure, are to consider themselves as under obligation to make inquiry, examine evidences, and proceed with such offenders according to the laws of Christ's kingdom. The following persons have been chosen members of that committee.

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#### NON-RESIDENT AND ABSENT MEMBERS.

At a Church meeting held April 29th, 1859, the following rule was adopted:—

It shall be the duty of every member of this church who goes abroad to reside permanently, to apply for a letter

of dismissal and recommendation to some other evangelical church, which holds communion with us ; such application to be made at the time of removal, or within one year, unless some satisfactory reason for omission shall be presented to the church. If they do not apply within one year, the church will not hold itself bound to give them certificates of being in good and regular christian standing. If no application for letters is made within two successive years, such absent members shall be considered as severed from the church. If, however, they should afterwards make satisfactory explanation or acknowledgement, they shall be restored, and shall be entitled to a letter.

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#### PASTORS AND STATED SUPPLIES.

No records remain in Branford to show when a church was organized here, but the Town Records show that as early as October, 1644, the settlers voted a salary to Mr. John Sherman as preacher. He remained in Branford until 1646 or 47. He came from England in 1634-5, preached at Watertown, Mass., removed with the emigrants to Wethersfield, from thence to Milford, in 1639, where he was chosen teacher or colleague. This office he declined. He was among the first settlers of Branford—and probably preached as a stated supply, until the coming of Mr. Pierson, about 1647, he returned to Watertown and was settled in the ministry there. He was a man of superior talents, and died aged 72.

Rev. Abraham Pierson was the first regular Pastor. He came to Branford, with a part of his congregation, from South Hampton on Long Island, and united with the original settlers from Wethersfield, in 1647. By this accession,

the settlement, and doubtless the church too, were much strengthened. The Town flourished until the union of the two colonies of Connecticut and New Haven. Being dissatisfied with the terms of that union, Mr. Pierson with a majority of his church, and a large proportion of the inhabitants removed and settled in Newark, New Jersey. From this period there was probably no organized church, and of course, no pastors for more than twenty years. There are no church records to show what was the state of religious feeling—whether there were revivals or hopeful conversions, or whether all was deep declension. The Town, however, was not left desolate, as writers of its history have repeatedly stated—nor were the Town records removed, or molested. Neither were they discontinued, and from them we gather some light respecting the religious history of the place. Such as the record of courts in which persons were tried and punished for immoralities—and votes to employ ministers—and in two instances at least they had stated supplies.

When Mr. Pierson removed to Newark, on the last of September, 1667, he employed Mr. John Bowers to preach in Branford, until the December following, when his salary for the year terminated. In December the people of the Town voted to pay Mr. Bowers £12 for his services during the period for which Mr. Pierson had engaged him; and they further voted to give him £40 a year, and the use of the Town House, and the upland and meadows adjoining, if he would remain with them and carry on the work of the ministry, and in February following, voted in addition to give him one days work of every planter. He continued with them from year to year; and in May, 1671, the Town voted to give him a call or invitation to settle with them and carry on the work of the ministry. December 3d, of the same year he accepted the invitation. He however left

the place in 1672, or soon after. In 1678, August 1st, the Town unanimously gave Mr. John Harriman a call to come among them and carry on the work of the ministry. They had previously invited a Mr. John Wise, and also a Mr. Daniel Russell, to settle with them. In 1679, they had a Mr. Samuel Mather preaching with them, and February 13th, 1680, the Town voted unanimously, their earnest desire to have Mr. Mather settle in the Town, and carry on the work of the Gospel ministry—offering a salary of £60, with the improvement of the Town House, the buildings, the upland, and the meadows, belonging to it. This invitation was renewed at intervals until 1685—when the General Court or the Legislature of the colony ordered him to settle at Windsor. During an interval, and while Mr. Mather was preaching at Windsor, the people of Branford employed a Mr. Jonah Fordham of South Hampton, to preach for them; and in April, 1682, invited him to come and carry on the work of the ministry among them; offering a salary of £60, and the use of the Town House and lands.

Thus it is seen, that if there were no regular organized church in the Town, there were inhabitants here—and inhabitants who took great pains to obtain a minister, and to have all the institutions of the Gospel. The town was not desolate, as historians have represented, nor without preaching, for any length of time, together.

In March, 1688, the church was re-organized in due form, and the Rev. Samuel Russell, a son of the Rev. John Russell, of Hadley, and a graduate of Cambridge College, became their pastor. They had given him an invitation to settle with them, April 12, 1686, and he had accepted it on the 12th of September, 1687. His salary was £60, and the Society gave him as a settlement, the Town House, and lands connected with it. He was living in that house as



early as December 9th. 1686. His ministry closed with his life, June 25th, 1731. His talents were above mediocrity, and his pastorate a useful one. Including those who united in the organization, the whole number added were 262. The baptisms recorded are 870—and what is worthy of notice, only 33 of these were adults; so common was the practice of infant and household baptisms at that period. Mr. Russell left no record of a single church vote; the mode of conducting worship—of what psalms or hymns were used—or the manner of singing. Doubtless it was congregational, under the charge of a precentor, who gave out the hymn, line by line, and the people followed, as best they could, in such tunes as Wantage, Bangor, Mear, Old Hundred, and the like.

The next Pastor was the Rev. Philemon Robbins, ordained February 7th, 1733. His ministry closed with his life, August 13th, 1781. He died suddenly and alone, sitting in his study chair, in the 72d year of his age, and 49th of his ministry. He was a native of Charlestown, Mass., and a graduate of Cambridge or Harvard College. His pastoral life had more than the ordinary share of vicissitudes, but, on the whole, his was a popular, and a prosperous ministry. His records show that at the time of his ordination the church numbered 125 members. The additions during his ministry were 207.\* The Baptisms about 1100. Marriages 334.

February 11th, 1753, the church by vote requested the Rev. Mr. Robbins to introduce the practice of reading the Scriptures in public worship, and also the singing of Dr. Watts' Version of the Psalms.

The Rev. Jason Atwater, the next Pastor, was a native

of Hamden, Conn., and a graduate of Yale College. He was ordained by the Consociation, March 10th, 1784. He died of consumption, June 10th, 1794. His pastorate was ten years and three months. The Society gave him £300 settlement, and £100 salary, with the privilege of cutting firewood from the Society's lands. During his ministry 96 were added to the church. The baptisms were 187, of which number 19 were adults. Marriages 96. Although the Church and Society were not unanimous in their call, yet after the first excitement passed away, he seems to have had a peaceful and prosperous pastorate, and to have enjoyed the respect and confidence of his people.

The next pastor, Rev. Lynde Huntington, was a native of Norwich, and a graduate of Yale. His talents were of a superior order;—his religious creed strongly calvinistic. The call from the Church and Society was unanimous. He was ordained the 28th of October, 1795, and died of consumption, September 20th, 1804. The Society gave him as a settlement £300, and £95 salary—"with the privilege of cutting wood sufficient for his own fires from the Society's lands, so long as he shall continue to preach in said Society." The additions to the church under his ministry were 50, the baptisms 121, adults 2. Marriages 50.

The aged still remember and revere him.

The present Pastor, Rev. Timothy P. Gillett, son of the Rev. Alexander Gillett, of Torrington, is a graduate of Williams' College, Mass. He was ordained June 15th, 1808. The Society gave him "a salary of \$500, to be paid annually, until from continued ill health and infirmity, he is no longer able to perform the duties of the gospel ministry among them," with the privilege of cutting his firewood from the Society's land. The additions to the church

during his ministry, up to June 6th, 1859, have been 420, the baptisms 588, of which 102 were adults. Marriages 318.

### DEACONS.

The Church Records do not shew who were the first Deacons. At the time of Mr. Robbins' ordination, Feb. 7th, 1733, the Deacons were,

In a society's vote, passed in 1730, the name of Deacon Baldwin appears as a committee employed to hire an assistant to Mr. Russell. No other information is given respecting him. Probably he died before Mr. Robbins' ordination.

## ARTICLES OF FAITH.

The following are the Articles, or "Doctrine of Faith," and Covenant "agreed upon by the Church," probably in 1784, at the time of Mr. Atwater's settlement. There is no record of any other articles of Faith, ever adopted by the church.

1. You believe in the being of a God who is possessed of all perfections, natural and moral, and that he is the Creator of all things visible and invisible, and, (that) in the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

2. You believe the truth of the sacred Scriptures, that they are of Divine authority, and contain all that is to be believed and obeyed in order for salvation.

3. You believe in the universal Providence of God over all his works, and that his government is infinitely wise in all its branches.

4. You believe in man's original state of innocence and uprightness; in his fall and apostacy, (his) loss of innocence and holiness, and state of sin and misery.

5. You believe in the covenant of redemption, in which the Lord Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became the only Redeemer of God's elect, in order for which he became incarnate, paid an obedience to the law, satisfied Divine justice, and purchased eternal Redemption for sinners.

6. You believe in the necessity of Regeneration by the Spirit of God; and that Faith and Repentance are the gospel terms of justification through the righteousness of Christ; who is the Prophet, Priest and King of his church, and that he has instituted two Sacraments, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, as seals of the covenant between him and his people, which Sacraments are to continue to the end of the world.

7. You believe in the law of God, (that it is) holy, just, and good, in the gospel of God, to be all of free grace; in the

church of Christ as comprehending the whole number of believers; in the perseverance of the Saints, the immortality of the soul, the Resurrection of the dead, the Judgment of the great day and Life everlasting. Amen.

To this (these articles) you, (and each of you) give your assent.

#### THE COVENANT.

With a humble sense of your own unworthiness and dependence on Divine assistance, you do, as in the presence of the great, holy, and ever living God, and before this church as witnessess, give up yourself, (yourselves) and yours, first to God the Father, in and through Jesus Christ the Son, avouching him to be your God; and to Christ as your Redeemer, and to the Holy Ghost as your Sanctifier, Guide and Comforter. You do also give up yourself (yourselves) to this church as a church of Christ, to walk with it in a faithful attendance to all the ordinances and duties, that are to be attended, and in the enjoyment of all the privileges that are to be enjoyed in a particular visible church; promising to submit to the discipline of Christ in this church till regularly dismissed therefrom.

This you covenant and promise as God shall help you by his grace.

In the name of the Church; we do now receive you as a fellow member (fellow members,) in covenant with God and with us, and entitled to all the privileges of a particular, visible church, promising, that, by the strength of Divine grace, we will walk towards you and watch over you as such in the Lord; exhorting you and ourselves to maintain the purity of the Faith and Fellowship of the Gospel, till we arrive at the church triumphant in Glory.

This we covenant and promise, and pray God to watch over you and us.

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AGREEMENT ENTERED INTO BY THE PLANTERS, JUNE 20, 1667.

Forasmuch as that it appears that the undertaking and the settlement of this place of Branford, was procured by and for men of Congregational principles, as to Church order, according to the platform of discipline agreed on by the Synod in '48, or thereabout, drawn from the word of God in the main; we, that yet remain here, can say that we have found much peace and quietness, to our great comfort, for the which we desire to bless God; and that it may so remain to such as do continue their abode in this place, and to such as shall come in to fill up the rooms of those that are removed, and that do intend to remove from this place of Branford :

We all do see cause now for to agree that an orthodox minister of that judgement shall be called in and settled among us.

The gathering of such a Church shall be encouraged. The upholdment of such Church officers shall not want our proportional supply of maintenance, according to rule. We will not in any wise encroach upon or disturb their liberties in so walking from time to time and at all times: Nor will we be in any ways injurious to them in civil or ecclesiastical

respects. And this we freely and voluntarily engage ourselves unto jointly and severally so long as we remain inhabitants of this place,—and this we bind ourselves unto by our subscription to this agreement.

It is also agreed that whosoever shall come for purchase or to be admitted or planted here, shall so subscribe before admittance or his bargain be valid in law among us,
