## Historical Statement.

S early as the year 1834, the house of the Second Congregational Society, (the only one of our denomination in this part of the town), was filled to over-flowing. Investigations were made which revealed the fact that a very large number of the inhabitants of the city were entirely deprived of an opportunity to attend upon public worship. The importance of providing enlarged church accommodations, in some form, was urged by the Pastor and others, and was generally admitted. Numerous meetings for consultation were held, which resulted in January, 1838, in the call of a Society meeting, at which a committee was appointed to ascertain what families were disposed to associate in forming a new Church, and what funds could be raised for the erection of a new house of worship. Efforts were also made to secure a site for the new Church, with the expectation that the building would be erected by the entire Society, before a separation should take place.

These consultations and efforts, extending through a series of years, finally resulted, in January, 1842, in the withdrawal of a portion of the congregation to the Town Hall, where they established public worship.

On the 1st of June, 1842, the Church was organized under the title of the FIFTH CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, with one hundred and twelve members.

On the 31st of August following, Rev. WILLARD CHILD was installed as Pastor.

In 1844, a House of Worship was commenced, and was dedicated on the 1st of October, 1845. It stood on Main Street, upon the site now occupied by the Central Methodist Church.

Mr. CHILD asked, and received dismissal in August, 1845.

Rev. JOHN P. GULLIVER was ordained and installed, October 1st, 1846.

By a vote passed April 9th, 1847, the name of the Church was changed to MAIN STREET CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

On Sunday evening, Sept. 17th, 1854, the House of Worship on Main Street, was destroyed by fire.

During nearly two years following, the congregation worshiped in the Town Hall.

On the 13th of October, 1857, the present church edifice on Broadway was dedicated.

By a vote passed subsequently, the name of the Church was again changed to BROADWAY CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

In May, 1864, a member of the Church gave one thousand dollars as a fund for the foundation and maintenance of a Library for the use of the Pastor. By vote of the Church, the fund is known as "The Buckingham Fund." The Library now numbers one hundred and seventy-three volumes.

Rev. Mr. GULLIVER resigned his office as Pastor, October 7th, 1865, and was dismissed by the action of a Council, convened October 24th of the same year.

In the Summer of 1866, a Chapel, costing with the lot \$5,500, was erected on Boswell Avenue, and given to the

Society by a member of the Church, for religious purposes. It was furnished by the ladies, was dedicated in December, 1866, and has since been occupied by the AVENUE CHAPEL SUNDAY SCHOOL.

The Church remained without a Pastor until June, 1868, when Rev. DANIEL MERRIMAN, then a student at Andover Seminary, was called. He was ordained, and installed as Pastor, Sept. 30th, 1868.

The Standing Rules, Articles of Faith, Forms of Admission and of Baptism contained in this Manual, were revised and prepared by a committee appointed for the purpose, and were unanimously adopted by the Church, May 29th, 1873.

## Standing Rules.

### Officers.



THE officers of this Church shall be a Pastor, six Deacons, a Clerk, a Treasurer, and three Committee-men.

II. The Pastor shall be chosen whenever a vacancy occurs.

III. The Deacons shall be elected for three years, at the annual meeting: two being chosen each year.

IV. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be elected for three years, at the annual meeting.

V. The three Committee-men shall be elected for one year, at the annual meeting.

VI. The Pastor, Deacons, Clerk and three Committee-men shall constitute the Standing Committee of the Church.

VII. All officers shall be chosen by ballot, without nomination, unless by a committee appointed for that purpose.

VIII. It shall be the duty of the Pastor to preach the Word, to administer the sacraments, and to take the spiritual oversight of the Church. He is expected to be a member of the Church; shall be *ex-officio* its Moderator; and shall preside at its meetings, unless a meeting shall be called to act upon some question concerning his pastoral relation, or Christian character, and unless objection shall be made, in which cases a Moderator shall be chosen from the brethren.

IX. It shall be the duty of the Deacons to assist in the administration of the sacraments, to preside at the meetings in the absence of the Pastor, to distribute the charities of the Church, and to look after the sick, the destitute, and strangers.

X. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep distinct and full minutes of all the business transactions of the Church; a record of all receptions, dismissions and deaths of members; of all baptisms, both of infants and adults; of all members of other Churches who habitually commune with this Church; of all non-resident members of this Church, with the length of time they have been absent; and he shall make a full written report of all these matters at the annual meeting of the Church. He shall also act as Clerk of the Standing Committee; he shall conduct the correspondence of the Church; shall issue letters of dismissal and recommendation, in accordance with its rules; shall have charge of its archives, and shall prepare and keep a proper catalogue and index of all its members.

XI. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of all money contributed for the expenses and poor of the Church, and to disburse it under the direction of the Deacons; to receive and pay over to the proper officers, all money contributed by the congregation to charitable objects, and to make at the annual meeting, a written and detailed report of all receipts and payments, and so far as possible of the entire charities of the congregation, which report shall be audited by direction of the Standing Committee.

XII. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to provide for the examination of all candidates for admission to the Church; to advise respecting objects

of benevolence that may come before the Church; to provide, on such terms as the Society Committee shall direct, a supply for the pulpit during a vacancy in the pastoral office, or during the temporary absence of the Pastor,—unless a special committee be appointed by the Church for that purpose; to bring before the Church such cases and measures of discipline as shall be necessary; to provide for auditing the report of the Treasurer; to fix the time of the annual meeting, according to the rule, and to conduct any other business that may be referred to it by the Church.

#### *Admission of Members.*

XIII. Persons who desire admission to this Church, on confession of their faith, shall be examined as to their doctrinal sentiments and personal piety, in such manner as the Standing Committee shall determine; if approved by the Committee, their names shall be propounded to the Church, at least two weeks, and to the congregation one week, previous to their admission; and when received, it shall be in accordance with the prescribed form.

XIV. Persons who propose to unite with this Church by letter from other Churches, shall be examined as to their doctrinal sentiments and personal piety, in such manner as the Standing Committee shall determine; if approved by the Committee, their letters of recommendation shall be read to the Church, at least one week previous to their admission; and when received it shall be in accordance with the prescribed form.

#### *Dismission of Members.*

XV. Members of this Church who remove from the place, shall be expected to take letters of dismission and of recommendation to some Evangelical Church,

within *one year* from the date of their removal, and unless satisfactory reasons shall be given to the Standing Committee, the neglect of this duty shall be regarded as a breach of covenant. Letters of dismissal and recommendation shall be granted by vote of the Church, to members in good and regular standing, upon their application; but such letters shall be valid for only one year from their date; they shall be given only to some specific Church; no member can rightfully join any other Church, except by first asking and receiving such letter; and no member shall be considered as regularly dismissed from this Church, until evidence of his reception by another Church shall be received by this.

#### Meetings.

XVI. The annual meeting of the Church, for the choice of officers, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at such time in the month of January as the Standing Committee shall appoint.

XVII. The close of the weekly prayer meeting shall be regarded as a proper time for the transaction of such business of a general character, as a majority of the Standing Committee present, shall approve.

XVIII. Special meetings shall be called by the Pastor, or Standing Committee, upon their own motion, or at the request of any five members.

#### Amendments.

XIX. These rules may be amended at any regular meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting:—*provided*, that amendments be proposed in writing, at least two weeks previous to such meeting. This rule shall not be so construed as to forbid the temporary suspension of any rule, when the Church shall *unanimously* order such suspension.

# Articles of Faith.

## Article I.

**W**E believe in the existence of One only living and true God, three persons in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; the same in substance, and equal in power and glory; who is possessed of all possible perfection and divine excellence; the Creator and Preserver of all things, as He has revealed Himself in the Holy Scriptures.

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. Deut. 6: 4, 5.

I am the Lord, and there is none else; there is no God beside me. Isaiah 45: 5.

Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well; the devils also believe and tremble. James 2: 19.

I am the Lord; that is my name; and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images. Isaiah 42: 8.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. All things were made by him. John 1: 1, 2.

When he bringeth in the first begotten into the world, he saith: And let all the angels of God worship him. Heb. 1: 6.

Thus saith the Lord: Cursed be the man that trusteth in man, and maketh flesh his arm, and whose heart departeth from the Lord. Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord, and whose hope the Lord is. Jer. 17: 5-7.

Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and ye perish from the way, when his wrath is kindled but little. Blessed are all they that put their trust in him. Psalm 2: 12.

But Peter said: Ananias, why hath Satan filled thine heart to lie to the Holy Ghost, and to keep back part of the price of the land? Thou hast not lied unto men, but unto God. Acts 5: 3, 4.

Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Matt. 28: 19.

Thou, even thou art Lord alone; thou hast made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth, and all things that are therein, the seas, and all that is therein, and thou preserveth them all; and the host of heaven worshipeth thee. Nehemiah 9 : 6.

### Article II.

We believe the writings of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, a perfect rule of Faith and practice, and able to make us wise unto salvation, through faith in Christ Jesus.

We have also a more sure word of prophecy, whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day-star arise in your hearts; knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man; but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost. II. Peter 1 : 19-21.

Continue thou in the things which thou hast learned, and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them : and that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness; that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works. II. Tim. 3 : 14-17.

Search the Scriptures: for in them ye think ye have eternal life; and they are they which testify of me. John 5 : 39.

### Article III.

We believe, that by transgression, all mankind have fallen from their original righteousness and communion with God, and so are become dead in trespasses and sins, and are justly liable to His wrath and displeasure forever.

And the Lord God commanded the man, saying: Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof, thou shalt surely die. And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof and did eat; and gave also unto her husband with her, and he did eat. And they heard the voice of the Lord God, walking in the garden in the cool of the day; and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God amongst the trees of the garden. Gen. 2 : 16, 17, and 3 : 6-8.

God hath made man upright; but they have sought out many inventions. Ecl. 7 : 29.



By one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned. Romans 5: 12.

That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. John 3: 6.

Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like; of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things, shall not inherit the kingdom of God; but the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance, against such there is no law. Gal. 5: 19-22.

So then they that are in the flesh, cannot please God. But ye are not in the flesh, but in the spirit, if so be that the spirit of God dwell in you. Rom. 8: 8, 9.

Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Marvel not that I said unto thee, ye must be born again. John 3: 3, 7.

What fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? And what concord hath Christ with Belial? II. Cor. 6: 14, 15.

#### Article IV.

We believe that the Lord Jesus, by His mediation and death, has made atonement for the sins of the world: and that by the effectual call of God's free and sovereign grace alone, through the quickening, renewing and sanctifying influences of the Holy Spirit, are any restored to spiritual life, made partakers of the faith of the Gospel, and entitled to its special ordinances.

Without shedding of blood is no remission. When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said: IT IS FINISHED; and he bowed his head and gave up the ghost. Heb. 9: 22. John 19: 30.

And he is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world. I. John 2: 2.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy, hath begotten us again unto a lively hope, by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation. I. Peter 1: 3-5.

Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sins of the world. John 1: 29.

You hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins. Eph. 2 : 1.

By grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them. Now, in Christ Jesus, ye who sometimes were far off, are made nigh by the blood of Christ. Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens with the saints, and of the household of God, and are built upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone; in whom all the building fitly framed together, groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord; in whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the spirit. Eph. 2: 8-10, 13, and 19-22.

If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. II. Cor. 5: 17.

Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation [judgment] to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep. I. Cor. 11: 28-30.

Examine yourselves whether ye be in the faith: prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Christ Jesus is in you, except ye be reprobates. II. Cor. 13: 5.

The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? Ye cannot drink the cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the Lord's table and the table of devils. I. Cor. 10: 16, 21.

Then shall ye begin to say, we have eaten and drunk in thy presence and thou hast taught in our streets. But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not, whence you are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out. Luke 13: 26-28.

Lord thou knowest all things, thou knowest that I love thee. John 21: 17.

### Article v.

We believe that the Sacraments of the Church are Baptism, and the Lord's Supper; that Baptism is to be administered to believers and their infant children, and that the Lord's Supper is to be received by His disciples.

Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Matt. 28: 19.

Repent and be baptized every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ, for the remission of sins. Acts 2: 38.

And when she was baptized and her household. Acts 16: 15.

And was baptized, he and all his, straightway. Acts 16: 33.

For I have received of the Lord Jesus, that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood. I. Cor. 11: 23-25.

### Article VI.

We believe that faith without works is dead, and that these are to be done continually, in obedience to God's commandments, as fruits and evidences, whereby we do glorify God, edify the brethren, and adorn the profession of the Gospel.

Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you. John 15: 14.

Why call ye me Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say? Luke 6: 46.

In Christ Jesus, neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but a new creature. Gal. 6: 15.

As the body, without the spirit, is dead; so faith without works is dead also. Shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works. James 2: 26, 18.

Be ye therefore followers of God as dear children. For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord; walk as children of light; (for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness, and truth;) proving what is acceptable unto the Lord, and have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret. Eph. 5: 1, 8-12.

Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you and will be a father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty. II. Cor. 6: 17, 18.

Bring forth, therefore, fruits meet for repentance. Matt. 3: 8.

Ye are the light of the world. Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven. Matt. 5: 14, 16.

He that endureth to the end shall be saved. Matt. 10: 22.

Blessed is that servant, whom his Lord when he cometh shall find so doing. Matt. 24: 46.

I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot; I would thou wert cold or hot. So, then, because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth. Rev. 3: 15, 16.

And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees ; therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. Matt. 3 : 10.

### Article VII.

We believe that as Christ rose, so there will be a resurrection of all the dead, and that God hath appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ, and whereby He will magnify the glory of His mercy in the salvation of the elect, and of His justice in the eternal condemnation of the finally impenitent.

Marvel not at this ; for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth ; they that have done good unto the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation. John 5 : 28, 29.

Now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept. I. Cor. 15 : 20.

God now commandeth all men everywhere to repent : because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness, by that man whom he hath ordained, whereof he hath given assurance unto all men, in that he hath raised him from the dead. Acts 11 : 30, 31,


For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad. II. Cor. 5 : 10.

Whose fan is in his hand, and he will thoroughly purge his floor, and will gather the wheat into his garner, but the chaff he will burn with fire unquenchable. Luke 3 : 17.

When the Son of man shall come in his glory and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory : and before him shall be gathered all nations ; and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats. And he shall set the sheep on his right hand ; but the goats on the left. Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. Then shall he say also to them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels. And these shall go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into life eternal. Matt. 25 : 31-46.

And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie. Whereunto he called you by our gospel, to the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. II. Thes. 2 : 11, 14.

## Explanatory Note.

OR the purpose of indicating the relation which the Articles of Faith sustain to the Form of Admission, this Church has adopted the following

### Minute:

The foregoing Articles of Faith, which have been essentially professed by this Church since its organization, we hereby re-affirm and declare to be, in form, the doctrines which we hold.

As such, we expect that the Pastor and other officers of the Church will assent to them, and that they will be the constitutional ground for the administration of the Church. We also expect that the teaching of the Pulpit, and of the Sunday-school, will conform to them; that they will be the basis for the examination of candidates for admission to the Church; that the young, and those weak in the faith will study them; that at suitable times they will be read, explained and commented upon by the Minister, in connection with public worship; and that they will be the substantial expression of the Faith of the members.

But we desire to administer this Church under the rule, and in the spirit of Christ, and to receive to membership in it, on confession of Him, those who upon examination give credible evidence of a new life, and of agreement with us in the substance of His doctrine. Hence we do not require, as a condition of such membership and confession, that all who apply, especially if they be young, or of imperfect knowledge, shall completely understand, or fully avow these Articles.

For this reason we have adopted the following form for the admission of members.

## Form of Admission.

[The names of the candidates having been read, they shall take their places before the pulpit, while the minister is reciting one or more of the following verses of Scripture:]

JESUS SAITH :

Whosoever therefore shall confess Me before men, him will I confess, also, before My Father which is in heaven.

He that loveth father or mother more than Me, is not worthy of Me : and he that loveth son or daughter more than Me, is not worthy of Me.

If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me.

[The minister shall address the candidates, saying:]



EARLY Beloved, you are here before God and these witnesses, to confess the Lord Jesus Christ, and to dedicate yourselves to Him in the everlasting covenant of His grace. Feeling the solemnity and blessedness of this privilege, and praying with us that He who hath begun a good work in you, will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ, you now unite with us in this

### Confession.

WE BELIEVE in one God, the Father Almighty, the Creator and Ruler of all things :

And in Jesus Christ, His Son, our Lord ; who was in the beginning with God, and was God ; who for our salvation became man, was crucified, dead and buried ; who rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God, the Father ; whence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead :

And in the Holy Ghost, the Comforter; through whom alone we are renewed and sanctified; who, with the Father, and the Son, together one God, is supremely to be loved and served:

And in the forgiveness of sin, through repentance and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ:

And in the Holy Scriptures, as a perfect rule of faith and duty:

And in one Church of the Redeemed on earth and in heaven; and in one Baptism for the remission of sins; and in one Communion of Saints; and we look for the Resurrection of the dead, and the Life everlasting. Amen.

### Covenant.

In the presence of God and this assembly, you do now freely acknowledge the Father Almighty, your Maker and Preserver, the Lord Jesus Christ, your Saviour and Master, and the Holy Spirit, your Sanctifier and Guide, to be your God.

You do trust only in His sovereign grace and almighty power.

And you do promise that you will faithfully endeavor to keep His commandments, and follow Him in all things; to walk with His disciples in love; and denying all ungodliness and worldly lusts, to live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world, looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.

This you truly confess and heartily promise?

[The candidates shall assent by bowing.]

### Baptism.

You who in childhood were admitted by baptism to a place in the covenant of God, do now, of your own accord, assume its full obligations and privileges; and

[The foregoing shall be omitted if none have been baptized.]

To you who have had no part, by baptism, among the people of God, we do now apply the seal of the covenant.

[The foregoing shall be omitted if all have been baptized.]

[Here the minister shall baptize those who have never been baptized, saying to each, and using only the Christian names:]

—————, I baptize thee into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

### **Covenant with the Church.**

[Here those who unite by letter, and who shall be seated in front, shall rise, and for them (in case none join on confession) the form of admission shall begin with the following words:]

You do now Beloved, cordially join yourselves to this Church of Christ, and you solemnly promise that you will faithfully endeavor to honor it in your conduct and life; to give diligent attendance upon its services; to uphold its faith; to submit to its rules and discipline; to labor and pray for its increase, purity and peace; and to walk with its members in charity and faithfulness.

This you heartily promise?

[The candidates shall assent as before.]

We then, as members of this Church,

[Here the members of the Church shall rise.]

do affectionately welcome you, in the name of Christ, to His discipleship; to a part with us in the blessings and promises of His covenant; to a share in the duties, privileges and glories of His Church; and to the fellowship of that great multitude whom no man can number, who are redeemed by the blood of the Lamb.

And we promise, through the help of Christ, to walk with you in all helpfulness, charity and watchfulness.



And now Beloved, remember that ye are fellow-citizens with the Saints, and of the household of God. For this cause

[Here all bow the head in prayer.]

we make supplication unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man; that Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith, that ye being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all saints, what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height, and to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge.

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace.

Now unto Him that is able to keep us from falling, and to present us faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and for ever. Amen.

## Form of Baptism for Infants.

[This Church regards it as the duty and privilege of believing parents to consecrate their infant children to God in Baptism. This may be done at any time in connection with public worship, notice having previously been given to the minister. While the choir is chanting the words:]

Jesus saith: Suffer little children to come unto me.

[The parents without waiting, shall present themselves, with their children, before the pulpit, when the minister shall address them saying:]

**D**EARLY Beloved: You present yourselves here to consecrate your child unto God. You rely upon the word of His covenant that He will be a God to His people, and to their children after them; and you promise that you will faithfully endeavor to bring up this child in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, so that he may be led, through Christ's grace, to own this covenant himself, in due time.

This you truly and heartily engage?

[The parents shall assent by bowing.]

[Then the minister shall baptize the child saying, and using only the Christian names:]

———, I baptize thee into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

[After which he shall offer a short prayer.]
