

Creed.

The following Creed, known as "The Creed of 1883," was prepared by a commission of twenty-five members, under the appointment of the National Congregational Council of 1880. It was adopted by vote of this church February 26th, 1884. It expresses the common faith of the Congregational Churches of this country. It need not be used in the admission of members.

I. We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who is of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made;

And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life, who is sent from the Father and Son, and who together with the Father and Son is worshiped and glorified.

II. We believe that the providence of God, by which he executes his eternal purposes in the government of the world, is in and over all events; yet so that the freedom and responsibility of men are not impaired, and sin is the act of the creature alone.

III. We believe that man was made in the image of God; that he might know, love, and obey God, and enjoy him forever; that our first parents by disobedience fell under the righteous condemnation of God; and that all men are so alienated from God that there is no salvation from the guilt and power of sin except through God's redeeming grace.

IV. We believe that God would have all men return to him; that to this end he has made himself known, not only through works of nature, the course of his providence, and the consciences of men, but also through supernatural revelations made especially to a chosen people, and above all, when the fullness of time was come, through Jesus Christ his Son.

V. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the record of God's revelation of himself in the work of redemption; that they were written by men under the special guidance of the Holy Spirit; that they are able to make wise unto salvation; and that they constitute the authoritative standard by which religious teaching and human conduct are to be regulated and judged.

VI. We believe that the love of God to sinful men has found its highest expression in the redemptive work of his Son; who became man, uniting his divine nature with our human nature in one person; who was tempted like other men, yet without sin; who by his humiliation, his holy obedience, his sufferings, his death on the cross, and his resurrection, became a perfect Redeemer; whose sacrifice of himself for the sins of the world declares the righteousness of God, and is the sole and sufficient ground of forgiveness and reconciliation with him.

VII. We believe that Jesus Christ, after he had risen from the dead, ascended into Heaven, where, as the one mediator between God and man, he carries forward his work of saving men; that he sends the Holy Spirit to convict them of sin, and to lead them to repentance and faith, and that those who through renewing grace turn to righteousness, and trust in Jesus Christ as their Redeemer, receive for his sake the forgiveness of their sins, and are made the children of God.

VIII. We believe that those who are thus regenerated and justified, grow in sanctified character through fellowship with Christ, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and obedience to the truth; that a holy life is the fruit and evidence of saving faith; and that the believer's hope of continuance in such a life is in the preserving grace of God.

IX. We believe that Jesus Christ came to establish among men the kingdom of God, the reign of

truth and love, righteousness and peace; that to Jesus Christ, the head of this kingdom, Christians are directly responsible in faith and conduct; and that to him all have immediate access without mediatorial or priestly intervention.

X. We believe that the Church of Christ, invisible and spiritual, comprises all true believers, whose duty it is to associate themselves in churches for the maintenance of worship, for the promotion of spiritual growth and fellowship, and for the conversion of men; that these churches, under the guidance of the Holy Scriptures and in fellowship with one another, may determine—each for itself—their organization, statements of belief, and forms of worship, may appoint and set apart their own ministers, and should coöperate in the work which Christ has committed to them for the furtherance of the Gospel throughout the world.

XI. We believe in the observance of the Lord's Day, as a day of holy rest and worship; in the ministry of the Word; and in the two sacraments which Christ has appointed for his church; Baptism, to be administered to believers and their children, as the sign of cleansing from sin, of union to Christ, and of the impartation of the Holy Spirit; and the Lord's Supper, as a symbol of his atoning death, a seal of its efficacy, and a means whereby he confirms and strengthens the spiritual union and communion of believers with himself.

XII. We believe in the ultimate prevalence of the kingdom of Christ over all the earth; in the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ; in the resurrection of the dead; and in a final judgment, the issues of which are everlasting punishment and everlasting life.

Form of Admission.

Dearly beloved, called of God to be His child (children) through Jesus Christ our Lord, you are here that, in the presence of God and His people, you may enter into the fellowship and communion of his church. You do truly repent of your sins; you heartily receive Jesus Christ as your crucified Savior and risen Lord: you consecrate yourselves unto God and your life to His service: you accept His Word as your Law, and His Spirit as your Comforter and Guide; and trusting in His grace to confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, you promise to do God's holy will, and to walk with His church in the truth and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

With us and with the church throughout the world you confess the common faith, saying:

[The congregation joining.]

I believe in God the FATHER Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth; and in JESUS CHRIST, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the HOLV GHOST, born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried; the third day He rose from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the HOLV GHOST; the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sin; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

[Baptism is here to be administered to those who have not been baptized.]

Beloved in the Lord, you have all been baptized into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, have confessed the faith of Christ before witnesses and have given yourselves to God in an everlasting covenant of grace. You do now cordially unite yourselves with this church of Christ; to share with us in its worship and work; to walk with us in love and faithfulness, so long as your relation to us shall continue.

[The members of the church will here rise.]

We, then, the members of this church, receive you into our communion and welcome you with joy to our fellowship.

We promise to pray for you, to watch over you and help you so long as you shall continue with us.

God grant, that loving and being loved, serving and being served, blessing and being blessed, we may be prepared while we dwell together on earth for the perfect fellowship of the saints above.

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious unto you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace." Amen.

Historical Sketch

of the

First Congregational Church.

In 1666, the Rev. Moses Noyes came over from Saybrook to the Settlement at Lyme, to preach. There was no organized church at this time; but the people united and built a small log house on the brow of Meetinghouse Hill, about the year 1668. Here they came for worship till the year 1689, when a new and more commodious house was built to accommodate the growing settlement. In 1693, twenty-seven years after Mr. Noyes came to Lyme to preach, this church was organized, and he was called to the pastorate, which he held twenty-seven years.

The next pastor was Rev. Samuel Pierrepont, who was settled in 1722. He was a young man of great promise, but his life and ministry were both cut short by the overturning of a canoe in the Connecticut River in March 1723, when he was drowned. The church was for seven years after this without a pastor. Then, in 1730 the Rev. Jonathan Parsons was chosen to the office, and continued his ministry until 1745, when he was dismissed, to become pastor of a presbyterian church organized at Newburyport, Mass., under the influence of Whitefield, whom Mr. Parsons helped in his revival work and with whom he was buried under the pulpit of the church at Newburyport.

In 1746 Rev. Stephen Johnson became pastor. For forty years he preached the Gospel in Lyme. He did more. He exposed the tyranny of Great

Britain, and urged the colonies to shake off the yoke and become free. He was chaplain of one of the regiments which Connecticut sent out during the Revolution. As preacher, writer, patriot, soldier, Stephen Johnson lifted Lyme into a prominence it could not otherwise have had, and made a permanent place in the hearts of all lovers of freedom, for this little town by the sea.

After an interval of over three years came the two years pastorate of Rev. Edward Porter.

Then in 1794, Rev. Lathrop Rockwell was chosen pastor, and continued in the office thirty-four years. He was followed by Rev. Chester Colton, who served the church from 1829 to 1840.

In 1841, the church made choice of Rev. Davis S. Brainerd. For thirty-four years he went in and out among this people,—his first and last parish, and his memory is fragrant with good deeds done, and lives stimulated to holiness.

Rev. Wm. B. Cary became the 9th pastor of this church on the 22nd of November, 1876, and continued in the office until 1884, when he accepted a call to the First Congregational Church in North Stonington.

Rev. Benjamin W. Bacon was pastor from June 12, 1884 to December 28, 1888.

Rev. Arthur Shirley was installed as the eleventh pastor, April 29, 1890.

In 1815, the third meetinghouse built by this church and society on Meetinghouse Hill was struck by lightning and destroyed.

In 1817, the present house was finished and dedicated, and it was repaired, and an organ was set up in 1850-1; in 1886-7 \$5,500. were expended in thoroughly repairing and beautifying the present edifice; a new organ and a new set of pulpit furniture were also presented to the church.

The Sunday School.

There are no authentic records of the establishment of the Sunday School. Even the method of organization, the number of scholars, or the number of classes is not definitely known. Tradition places the first meeting in the year 1819.

Oliver I. Lay, an energetic young man, a lifelong resident of the town, and a lifelong help to the church, was at the head of the Sunday School movement, and the nominal superintendent. How long he served is not known. He was followed by Deacon Charles Griswold, who was elected superintendent in the year 1830.

The exercises of the school at this time and for many years afterwards consisted in reading the Scriptures, repetition of verses memorized, and the catechetical instruction. Prizes were offered to the scholars who should memorize the greatest number of verses from the Bible. And it is a significant fact that a Negro girl took the first prize so offered a leather bound book, the second prize being a cloth bound book. The school met at first in the gallery of the church, the teachers standing before their classes in the pews below them.

Deacon Griswold served as superintendent until his death in 1839. He was followed by Mr. Daniel R. Noves, whose term of service extended over

many years,—interrupted by the temporary superintendency of Mr. Hart. Under Mr. Noyes, who became a deacon in 1862, the school flourished, and a great temperance work was carried on.

Oliver C. Waite was superintendent for a few months after Deacon Noyes resigned. Deacon R. C. Tinker also was superintendent for a short time. He was followed by Mr. A. L. Hall in 1864, who served three Summers, there being no school in Winter. At this time the sessions were held in the Conference room, and the school numbered about fifty scholars. The next superintendent was Deacon W. I. Moore. Under his term of service, from 1867 to May 1871, the school continued to improve. It numbered about one hundred scholars. In May 1871, Mr. I. Matson was elected superintendent, and has continued in the office until the present time.

II

Rules and Regulations.

This church recognizes the two great principles of Congregationalism: 1st, Local self-government. 2nd, Fellowship of the churches. Under these it gladly seeks to walk and work with all other denominations who accept Christ as their head.

The annual meeting of the church is held some time during the month of December.

The officers of the church are the Pastor, Deacons, Clerk, Treasurer, and Standing Committee.

The Standing Committee consists of the Pastor, Deacons, and three Brethren, the latter to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Admission of Members.

Members are received into this church either on confession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, or by letters of commendation from other evangelical churches. Candidates for admission to the church on confession of faith will meet the Standing Committee, and if their belief and religious experience are deemed satisfactory, shall be propounded publicly on the Sabbath. Two weeks later, if no objection is made, they may be received as members according to the usual form. Persons who bring letters from other churches are considered members when said letters are accepted by the church.

Dismissal of Members.

Members of this church may be dismissed to other churches at any time by a vote of the church. And it is recommended that members removing their residence to the vicinity of other churches, shall take such letters of dismissal when their home is fixed.

Discipline.

All complaints to the church against any of its members shall be presented to the moderator in writing, and shall state distinctly the offence charged, and that it can be proved by the proper number of witnesses, and also, that the previous steps have been taken, as required, according to the directions in Matt. XVIII; and that the offending person has given no satisfaction.

Any accused member found guilty of an offence and not making satisfactory confession, shall be admonished or suspended from church privileges until he gives satisfactory evidence of repentance, or may be excommunicated from the church, as the case may require. Such member, however, may, upon proper confession of his fault made to the church in writing and accompanied with satisfactory evidence of repentance, be restored to fellowship, such confession to be read before the church; and, in cases where the church shall deem best, before the congregation also.
