Herbert Hofmann-Ysenbourg was born in Germany and studied at the Bauhaus and at the Fine Arts Academy in Berlin. His first exhibition was held in the Alfred Flechtheim Gallery (Berlin-Düsseldorf) and so as a very young sculptor he took part in the intense cultural life vibrating in Europe in the late twenties.

He received the *Preis der Stadt Berlin* before he moved to Paris where he continued his studies with Aristide Maillol and Charles Despiau. There he won the *Jeune Europe* Prize. He travelled in Africa and in the East and upon his return settled in Athens.


Wanting to know America, he visited New York and then went to Mexico which particularly attracted him because of what he knew of its art and history. While he was in Mexico the Second World War started. Hofmann-Ysenbourg has lived there since that time and has become a Mexican citizen.

He has created innumerable portraits and sculptures for various collections in many parts of the world. He is a pioneer in the contemporary renaissance of religious art in Mexico. He works with the foremost architects and is especially interested in solving the problems of integrating sculpture and architecture.


In 1960 Hofmann-Ysenbourg received the José Clemente Orozco National Prize for Sculpture.


In 1962 he was awarded the Chac-Mool Prize of the First National Sculpture Biennial in Mexico.


