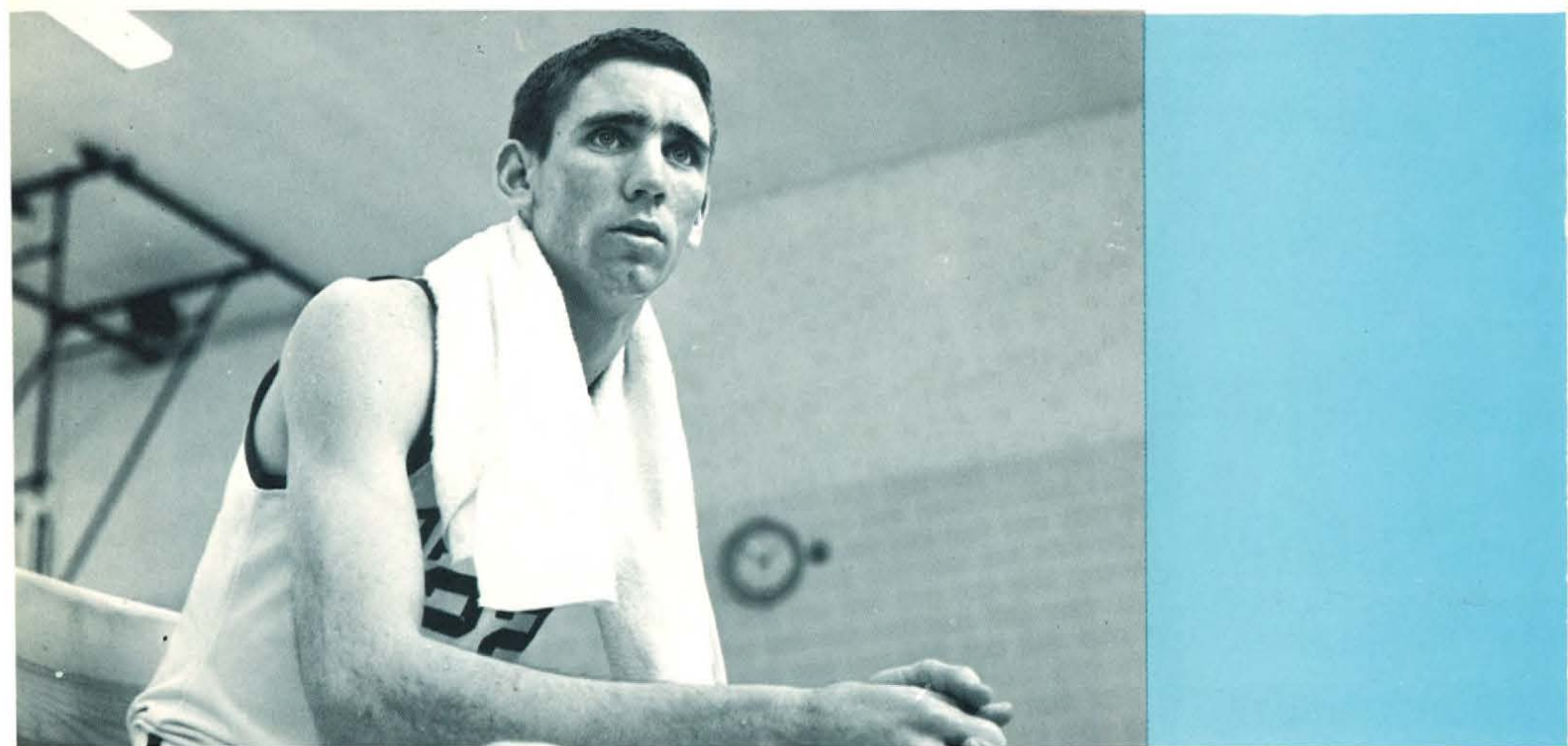

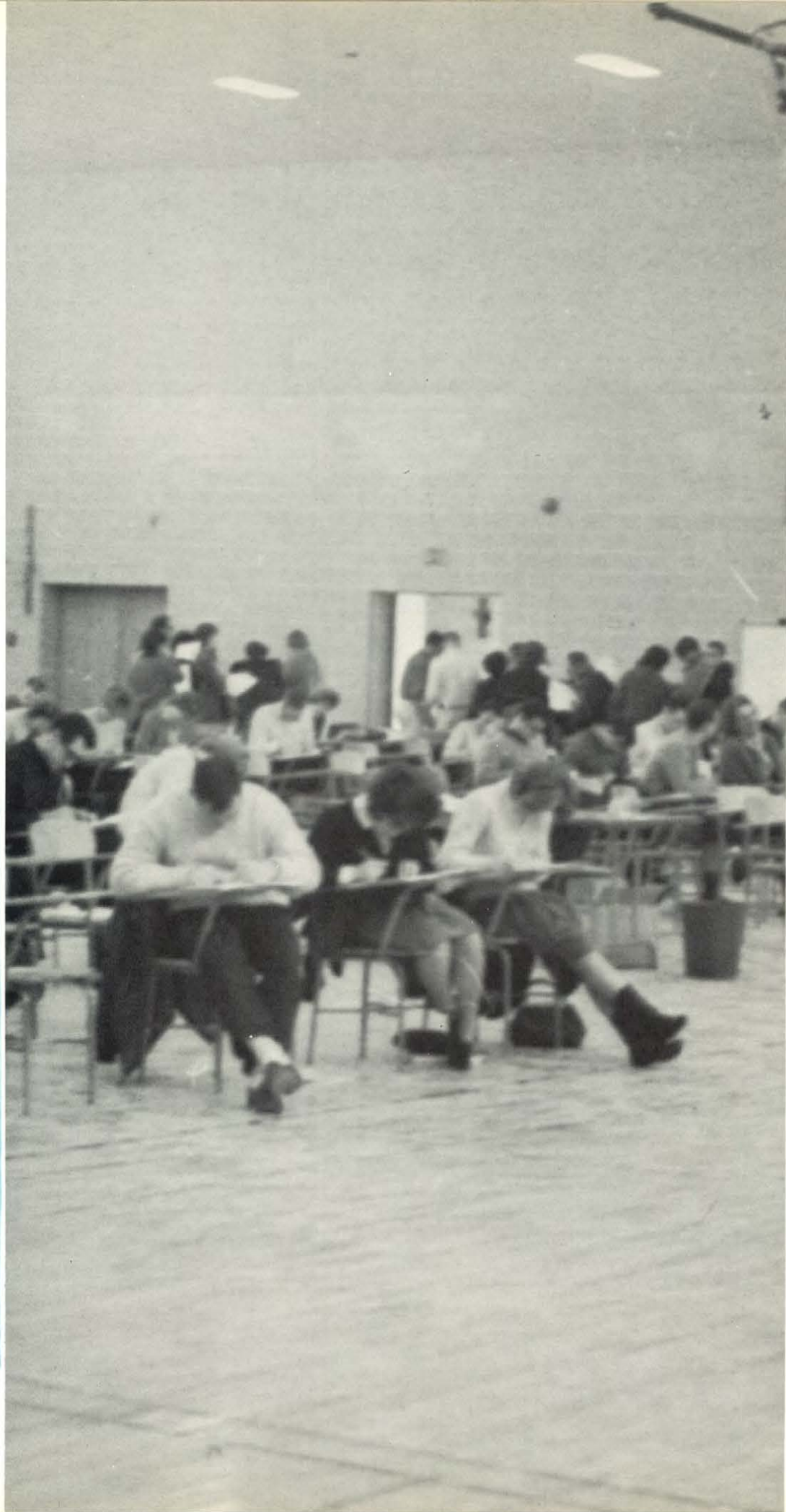
Memorial Hall is not one building on one campus, but it is a place in which the growth of the student both academically and socially is made evident.

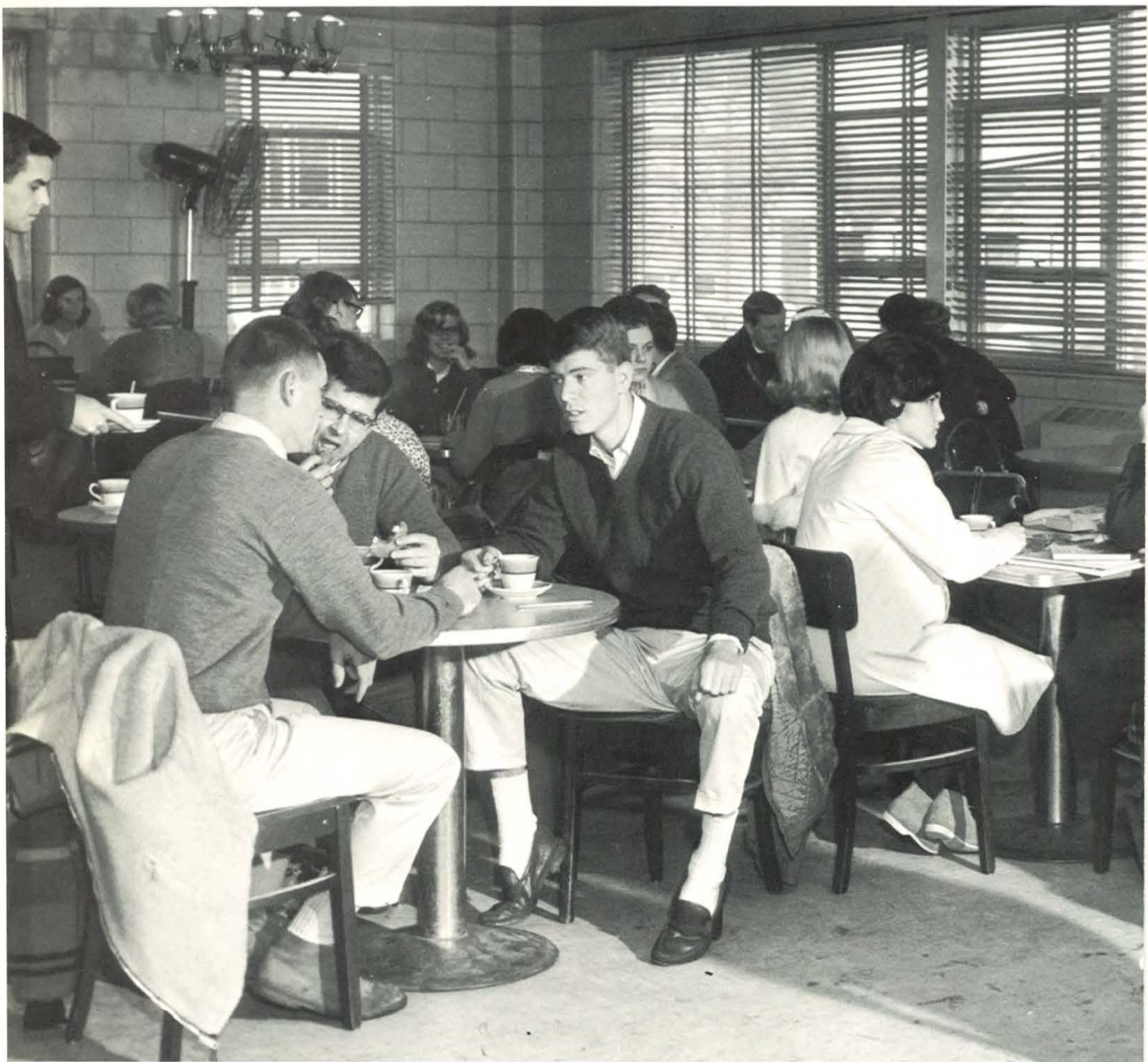


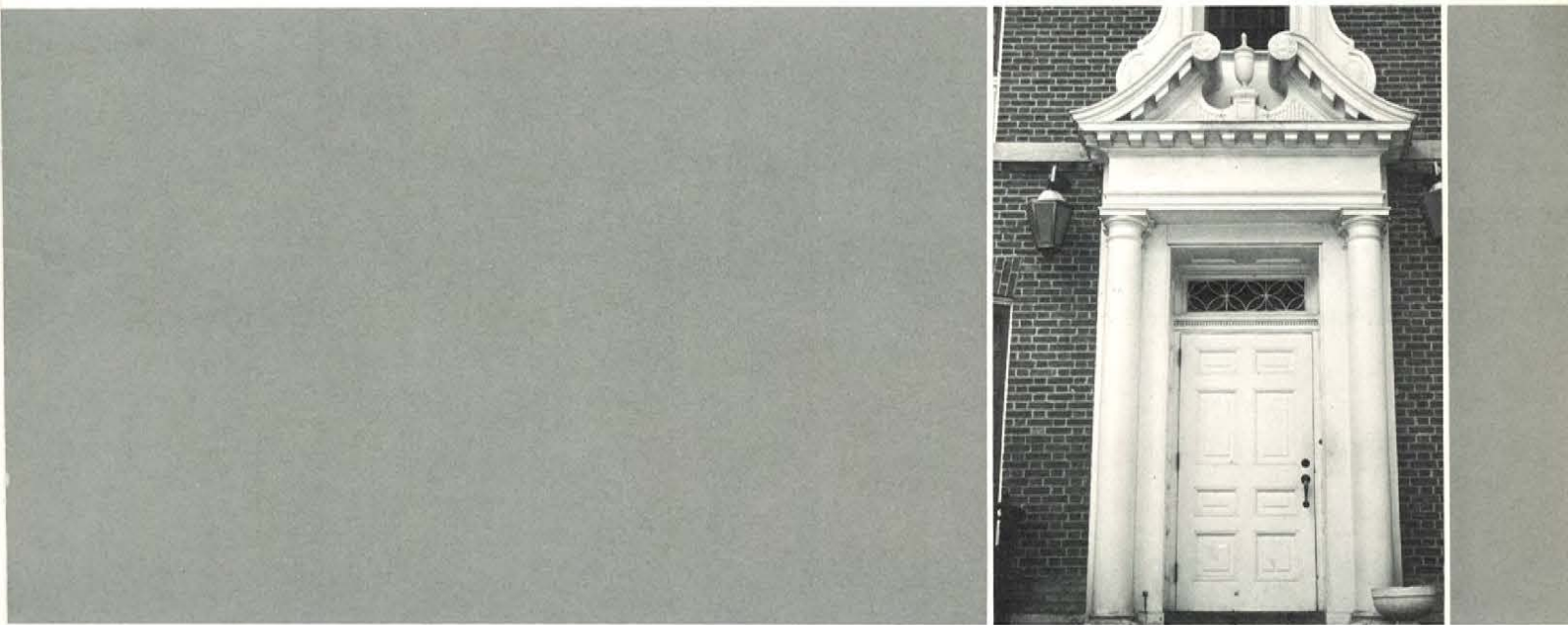
