Honorary Degree Recipient

DR. CLIFTON R. WHARTON, JR.

Educator and Statesman, Dr. Clifton R. Wharton Jr. is former Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association and the College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF). He served from February 1, 1987 to January 26, 1993. He thereby became the first Black to head a Fortune 100 service company. With assets over \$125 billion, TIAA-CREF is the nation's largest pension system, and the third largest U.S. insurance company.

Dr. Wharton came to TIAA-CREF from the State University of New York System where he had been Chancellor for nine years.

An economist, Dr. Wharton has had outstanding careers in foreign economic development, higher education, and business. Before accepting the SUNY Chancellorship, he was President of Michigan State University for eight years where he pioneered as the first Black to head a major predominantly white campus in the U.S. Prior to 1970, Dr. Wharton spent 22 years working in foreign economic development in Latin America and Southeast Asia for the Rockefeller family philanthropic interests.

The son of a career diplomat, Dr. Wharton spent six years of his childhood in the Canary Islands, Spain, where he became fluent in Spanish. His father served in the U.S. Foreign Service for 40 years and was the first Black to be named a Career Ambassador.

Born in Boston in 1926, Dr. Wharton attended Boston Latin School, America's first public school, and entered Harvard University at age 16. While an undergraduate student at Harvard, he was a founder and national secretary of the U.S. National Student Association. He received a B.A. in history from Harvard in 1947.

He was the first Black to be admitted to the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies, receiving his M.A. in international affairs in 1948. The University of Chicago awarded him an M.A. in economics in 1956 and the Ph.D. in 1958.

Dr. Wharton has won numerous awards, including Boston Latin School, "Man of the Year" (1970) and the Alumni Medal, University of Chicago (1980). In a recent national survey of more than 500 presidents of colleges and universities, he was identified as one of the five most influential leaders.

He has received 51 honorary degrees from such institutions as The University of Michigan, Wayne State University, The Johns Hopkins University, Oakland University, City College of New York, Georgetown University, and Columbia University, to name a few.

Dr. Wharton's awards are numerous. In February 1987, Dr. Wharton, with Leontyne Price and Leon Sullivan, was a recipient of the inaugural Black History Makers Award presented by Associated Black Charities at Carnegie Hall. In 1989, Dr. Wharton was awarded the Frederick Douglass Medallion, the New York Urban League's highest honor.



Dr. Wharton is a member of the National Academy of Education, the Committee for Economic Development, and numerous professional organizations. He has written extensively on the problems of development and is editor of the book, *Subsistence Agriculture and Economic Development* (1969), and coauthor with Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh and Dr. James Miller, of *Patterns for Lifelong Learning* (1973). He has been a contributor to many professional journals.

Dr. Wharton was appointed by President Clinton as Deputy Secretary of State, the first Black ever to hold this second highest foreign policy post. He resigned on November 22, 1993.

Dr. Wharton is married to the former Dolores Duncan. Trustee of several educational and not-for-profit centers and institutions, Mrs. Dolores Wharton is a corporate director, foundation executive, and arts advocate. She is the founder and Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of The Fund for Corporate Initiatives, Inc., a nonprofit organization devoted to strengthening the role of minorities and women in the corporate world.

Mrs. Wharton lived in Danbury on Lake Kenosia, and attended Danbury High School, though she graduated from Bethel High. Mr. and Mrs. Wharton were married on Marian Anderson's estate 44 years ago.

The Whartons have two sons, Clifton 3rd and Bruce.




Certificate of Achievement Recipient
JOHN C. RAGLAN

John C. Raglan joined the faculty of Western Connecticut State University in 1970, following a distinguished career as an executive with the McGraw-Hill Publishing Company. Prior to joining McGraw-Hill, Mr. Raglan was a teacher and later became a Commissioned Officer in the U.S. Pacific Fleet during the Second World War.

Mr. Raglan served in a variety of positions at Western from 1970 to his retirement in 1983. He founded the business school, which subsequently became the widely respected Ancell School of Business, and developed the Master's degree curriculum. He also organized the program in criminal justice, now the Division of Justice and Law Administration.

As Associate Dean for Educational Services, Mr. Raglan created the Career Development Center, including the Cooperative Education Program and auxiliary counseling services. He presided over the restructuring of many campus offices in the 1970's in order to meet the needs of the growing corporate community in the Western region of Connecticut.

Mr. Raglan obtained a B.Ed. degree in business from Illinois State University and the M.S. degree in Marketing from the University of Colorado. He now resides in Crystal Lake, Illinois.



THE PAGEANT OF ACADEMIC COMMENCEMENT

The Grand Marshal and University Mace

The honor of Grand Marshal of the Commencement Procession is usually conferred upon a senior and distinguished member of the faculty. The Grand Marshal carries the University Mace, which badge of office signifies the official authority inherent in the Commencement Exercises, that is, to grant degrees. The office of mace bearer is purely ceremonial, and derives from medieval times in England when an official, say the Lord of Admiralty or the Chief Justice of the Assizes, was taking office or opening his court and needed a bodyguard. Then the mace, a formidable weapon, was held ready to protect the person of the dignitary. From the Sixteenth Century in England and since Colonial days in America, it has become only a symbol of office and authority.

Academic Costume

Faculty members and graduates wear the caps, gowns and hoods designating their degrees and the colleges or universities which conferred them.

The tassel of the mortarboard or cap is worn over the left front quarter of the cap, after a degree has been conferred. Bachelor's and Master's caps have black tassels; the tassel for the Doctor is gold.

The gown signifies the degree. The Doctor's gown of black silk is faced down the front with velvet; the bell-shaped sleeves are trimmed with three cross-bars of black or colored velvet distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains. The Doctor's gown is worn open. The Master's gown of black material is also worn open. It has very long sleeves, oblong in shape and closed at the base; the forearms protrude through notched slits near the elbows. The Bachelor's gown, which is of black material is worn closed. This gown is distinguished by its long pointed sleeves.

The hood, worn around the neck over the shoulders and down the back indicates the degree and the college or university which awarded it. The official colors of the institution which conferred the degree are used in the lining of the hood. The velvet edging of the hood indicates the degree: white for Bachelor of Arts; pink for Bachelor of Music; golden yellow for Bachelor of Science; and camel beige for Bachelor of Business Administration.

History

Much of American academic costume is derived from regalia worn at British universities, particularly Oxford. King Alfred the Great, who maintained his residence at Oxford, established some teaching facilities there after the Pope had suspended all institutions of learning in England in the year 886. Several of the kings of England who followed him kept their courts at Oxford and some were educated there. In 1214 Edward III granted a charter to the University. Its chancellor being the bishop's representative, there was a close connection between the University and the Church so its members wore clerical garb.

The earliest illustrations show gowns which somewhat resemble cassocks, being closed in front and reaching to the ground all around. Costume for higher degrees, like some of the sumptuously trimmed ecclesiastical vestments, was more elaborate. To this day the more colorful academic costumes are those worn at Oxford University functions. Many are made of colored silk and some are heavily embroidered.

The shape and size of the American hood marks the college degree of the wearer and, under the system established by the Intercollegiate Code, it is possible at an academic convocation to distinguish at a glance the bachelors, masters and doctors, and at the same time, recognize the university or college whence the degree was obtained.
