## INTRODUCTION

This paper has been designed to be a useful and practical tool for the classroom teacher. Previously there has been little written in a concise form which would aid the teacher in the use of folk tales with children in the intermediate grades, although many schools introduce the history of our country at these levels. Folk tales are an excellent way to develop understanding of the moods, emotions, and dreams of people in a new land adjusting sociologically to the geography of this vast continent.
